How do I register for summer camp?

Turn in your completed application and your registration fee to your designated church leader. The application must be completed by the camper's legal guardian. For the 2021 youth camp season all registration fees will be a discounted rate of \$125 per camper.

IT IS VERY IMPORTANT THAT ALL GROUPS AND CAMPER ADHERE TO THE ARRIVAL TIMES. NO ONE WILL BE ALLOWED ON CAMPUS PRIOR TO THE DESIGNATED ARRIVAL TIMES, WE MUST HAVE OUR TEAM IN PLACE AND READY FOR HEAD CHECKS AND REGISTRATION! THIS IS A NON NEGOTIABLE. THERE IS A SUBWAY AND A PARK BOTH LOCATED IN HEBER-OVERGUARD THAT YOU CAN HANG OUT AT IF YOU GET TO TOWN EARLY.

Can kids stay an extra day or arrive one day early?

No – No exceptions.

Housing Accommodations

All campers will be staying in dormitories with appropriate amount of Counselors/Counselor Assistants. The dorms are equipped with bunk beds and have a/c. Sleeping bags are recommended for bedding and/or a twin fitted sheet to cover the mattress. Showers and restrooms are located in each dorm.

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Food Accommodations

All meals will be served in the cafeteria area. Every camper will receive breakfast, lunch, and dinner. The Snack Shack will be open in the afternoon and after each night service for the purchase of additional drinks and snacks.

Examples of items typically available include Gatorade, soda, popsicles, candy, slim jims, chips, etc. Some nights, specialty items such as root beer floats, cheese fries, or chicken strips may also be available for purchase. Snack Shack prices range from \$0.25 - \$4.00.

Visitors

Does Camp Impact allow visitors?

Camp Impact does allow visitors, but we ask that upon your arrival you check-in with the camp director, or the camp's head counselors.

Does Camp Impact require a background check on adults?

Yes – Counselors/Volunteers must have a background check approved by the Registration Office, no exceptions.

Medical Information

Which medications should my child bring to camp?

Prescription medications should be in the original bottle with only the amount needed for the camper's length of stay at Camp Impact. All prescription bottles should come in a Ziploc bag with a completed Camp Impact Medication Form. All inhalers, nasal sprays, and EpiPen's must be in the prescription box with label and must NOT be expired. No over-the-counter medications should be brought to camp.

Do you give kids pain relievers if needed?

Yes – Designated medical staff is available at the Nurses' Station to dispense over-the-counter medication as needed. You need to give approval on the Camper Application if you would like the medical staff to give your child Tylenol.

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Does my child have to turn in his medicine even if he knows when to take it and how much?

Yes - Campers are allowed to bring prescription medications, but these must be turned in to the nurse at check-in (this includes inhalers).

What is your Lice Policy?

We ask that you have a thorough head check for each camper and staff member before leaving your church. We have a no nit policy. Upon arrival, all students and staff will be checked. If there's discovery, the leader will be responsible for returning the individual home

COVID – 19 Information

Our camp staff has implemented various sanitation measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19 (sanitation areas throughout the campus, frequent cleaning of high traffic/surface areas, social distancing, availability of face coverings, etc.). **Temperature checks will be taken upon arrival – ANYONE SHOWING COVID SYMPTOMS AT/PRIOR TO CHECK IN WILL BE REQUIRED TO RETURN HOME.**

- *NO electronic games
- *NO radios, CD, or MP3 players
- *NO prank or gag materials
- *NO clothing with vulgar or suggestive slogans
- *NO alcohol, drug, or tobacco products**
- *NO knives of any kind**
- *NO firearms or fireworks**

****Campers bringing these items into camp will be immediately dismissed.**

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CAMP IMPACT/IMPACT AZ SUMMER CAMP RULES AND POLICIES

1. All campers shall be responsible to all rules while attending camp. Failure to adhere to camp rules will result in a review by the camp staff and possible dismissal.
2. All campers shall pay the registration fee. No refunds shall be given except in cases of emergency.
3. Campers shall bring their own bedding, Bible, and personal effects and shall be responsible for the same during camp.
4. All campers must be present and on time for all meals and services during camp.
5. Campers must keep their dorms clean and neat at all times. A dorm check will be made daily. Sleeping quarters will be assigned to all campers. You will be expected to bunk there throughout camp. At lights out time you must be in your dorm. Anyone caught out on the campgrounds without permission will be dismissed from camp.
6. All campers will be assigned to a counselor. Please feel free to go to your counselor for any help you may need. Arrangements will be made for immediate dismissal to anyone showing disrespect to camp staff and counselors.
7. No camper or counselor will be allowed off the campgrounds at any time without proper authority. Stay within the boundaries of the camp. Do not go beyond the cleared area. Stay in the lighted area after dark.
8. No one is allowed in the dorms during activity or service times. You must have a counselor with you in the dorms. The opposite gender is not allowed in your dorm.
9. No swimming will be allowed except for supervised groups authorized by the camp director. Boys will be allowed to wear boxer type swimming trunks and girls will be allowed to wear a modest one-piece bathing suit or tankini style two piece.
10. You will be expected to dress in modest clothing and in a Christian-like manner at all times. There will be no mini-skirts or short shorts allowed (MUST FOLLOW FINGER TIP LENGTH RULE). Girls will not be allowed on the platform with short-skirts above the knees and sleeveless shirts/dresses. Boys being on the platform will look and dress like a gentleman. All of this is to edify Christ during our services. No clothing with vulgar or suggestive slogans.
11. No radios, CD, MP3, or IPOD's. No secular music, magazines, or books. No cell phones or electronic games.
12. No selling food.
13. No shaving cream, water guns, etc.
14. There will be no vandalizing or destruction of other people's property. This will result in dismissal.
15. There will be no practical jokes at other campers' expense. Counselors will strictly enforce this rule.
16. For your safety, there will be no running or horseplay in the dorms.
17. For your safety there will be no smoking, alcohol, knives, firearms, fireworks, or other harmful devices allowed. It is recommended to not bring valuable items or heirlooms.
18. There will be no public display of affection.
19. **THERE WILL BE A LICE AND TEMPERATURE CHECK FOR ALL CAMPERS UPON ARRIVAL. WE APOLOGIZE FOR ANY INCONVENIENCE AND RECOMMEND A CHECK AT YOUR HOME CHURCH BEFORE DEPARTURE. IN THE EVENT OF DISCOVERY ON OUR CAMPUS WE WILL HAVE TO ASK THE GROUP LEADER TO TAKE THE STUDENT HOME. WE HAVE NO FLEXIBILITY ON THE MATTER.**
